The application process for CAP-USAF is as follows:

- Member will need to reach out to me with their info, what state they reside in, etc. I will then send their info to the respective detachment commander who will reach out to the member for an interview.**
- If chosen to hire, a gain package will be collected and sent to me, member may need to use a recruiter as well depending on their status.**
- I will submit the gain package to RIO for processing.**

Civil Air Patrol Reserve Assistance Program (CAPRAP)

The Civil Air Patrol Reserve Assistance Program (CAPRAP) is managed by CAP-USAF (Civil Air Patrol-USAF), an active duty AF organization charged with providing oversight, advice and liaison to Civil Air Patrol (CAP). CAPRAP provides a truly unique opportunity for AF Reserve Airmen to serve as USAF representatives to the CAP, which can serve as the Air Force Auxiliary when performing Air Force missions. While serving your country as a Category E Reservist, you will assist in educating CAP members about aerospace history, encourage CAP cadets to pursue aerospace and cyberspace careers, help develop the skills of CAP members to provide emergency services during disasters, and participate in homeland security operations. USAF members transitioning from active duty AF, or currently in the AFR or ANG must see an AFR recruiter to apply for an assignment in the CAPRAP. Members currently in a Selected Reserve assignment must apply through RMG, Det 7 for an assignment in the CAPRAP.

If you want a one-of-a-kind reserve assignment where your military skills can really have an impact on a great team of your fellow Americans, then the CAPRAP is for you!

ABOUT CAPRAP

CAP-USAF/IMR at Maxwell AFB AL is the Program Manager for Reserve matters within CAP-USAF. RMG, Det 7/CCR at Randolph AFB TX is the Program Manager within AFRC for the CAPRAP program. The CAPRAP is open to all AFSCs. CAPRAP members assist CAP unit commanders with administration and leadership, teach aerospace subjects to cadets, and serve as staff officers and advisors at cadet summer encampments, flight clinics, and leadership workshops. CAPRAP members must meet normal readiness standards expected of PIRR members, to include a current RCPHA, dental exam, immunizations, HIV screening, fitness test, and security clearance.

The CAPRAP is an important part of the CAP-USAF process to oversee CAP. There are eight Liaison Regions (LRs) covering the 50 states, Washington D.C. and Puerto Rico. Each region has an active duty Commander (LR/CC) who is responsible for the overall operation of CAPRAP members in their region.

Northeast LR: CT, ME, MA, VT, PA, RI, NH, NJ, and NY

Middle East LR: DE, MD, DC, NC, SC, WV, and VA

Great Lakes LR: IN, IL, KY, MI, OH, and WI

Southeast LR: AL, FL, GA, MS, TN, and PR

North Central LR: IA, KS, MN, MO, NE, ND, and SD

Southwest LR: AZ, AR, LA, NM, OK, and TX

Rocky Mountain LR: CO, ID, MT, UT, and WY

Pacific LR: AK, CA, HI, NV, OR, and WA
